Midway on our life's journey, I found myself in a dark woods, the right road lost.

So begins one of the most famous passages in literature; and surely begins the bane of many high school students who have to muscle through the various translations of Dante's famous *Inferno*. Focusing on the term "midway," literary scholars emphasize both Dante's age and the point at which he finds his life balanced between a past of experience and a future of discernment and decisions. As the Cantos of the *Inferno* unfold, Dante is presented with the various pictures of sin's consequences, some rather graphic, and all quite memorable.

Although not as dramatic as what Dante sees on this symbolic journey, the upcoming rituals of Ash Wednesday present us with an equally potent and visual means to reflect on our actions, to understand the character of our wrongdoing, and to renew our promises to be faithful representatives of God's Reign. On Wednesday you may come for one of our formal liturgies: Mass at 8am and 6pm, or a Liturgy of the Word at 12pm. At each of these services you will have an opportunity to receive ashes on your forehead as signs of penance, a practice stretching back to the Jewish roots of Christian prayer, and a common symbol of sacred meaning in many cultures around the world. But if you aren't able to stay for a Mass or maybe only have a few minutes to spare, you may also come in and receive ashes from one of our team of lay ministers who will meet you, take you into a quiet space inside, and allow for a few moments of peace and reflection. This ritual is open to everyone; this means that you have the chance to invite your loved ones to Church, even if they're not Catholic! Our traditions are a beautiful means to help others experience God's grace. Who knows? Maybe we'll meet a future parishioner, godparent, sponsor, RCIA catechumen, or friend!


I am proud of our team of lay ministers who allow this to happen within the walls of our church. Apart from them, we have a team of students who will be doing the same for all four major college campuses in our area: Fresno State, Fresno City College, Fresno Pacific University, and Clovis Community College. In addition to being a day of solemn prayer and reflection, Ash Wednesday is also paradoxically a day of joyous outreach for the Newman Center. Thus at the beginning of Lent we get a taste of what Dante witnesses at the end of his dramatic journey: a vision of the celestial banquet in which all things are made new, and the stain of sin wiped away.


