THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A | APRIL 23, 2023

The vivid action of this Sunday's Gospel Reading invites all kinds of rich theological reflection, but I am drawn particularly to the scene where the two disciples urge Jesus to stay with them at their village dwelling: "...they urged him, 'Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." It is a tender image of unexpected intimacy, almost hinting at the sadness that the two would feel when this Stranger departs their company. This is a harbinger of the coming Pentecost and authentic Christian community, where the Holy Spirit's power brings Jesus' presence among the people in a whole new way. For a moment the sadness and disappointment of the Cross and Jerusalem are displaced by wonder and the burning of hearts.

When I was in college, the term I used for this kind of "burning" was "having a friend crush." It's the kind of desire that draws people together outside of purely physical attraction. Good Greek philosophical training tells me that there is still some *eros* at work here, but it's less "love at first sight" and more like the felt sense of "hmm, this feels right!" This reminds me of the ways that our young adults meet one another along their roads. Yes, some come for the scheduled Bible Study on Mondays, and others I'll see out in the crowd at the 7:00pm Mass. But the true depth of these interactions happens in the *in-between:* chatting about travel plans, catching up in the parking lot, seeing the eyes of someone they haven't seen in months light up when they know they are recognized. These encounters can change the anonymous worshiper into someone who feels that they are truly *seen*, truly *known*. In these and countless other examples of journeying, we

see that the road itself becomes a deep well of meaning, support, and communion with the Living God. I don't think I need to remind you of the challenges that young people face daily, and thus the importance of such support.

This story of Emmaus also inspired Pope Francis from the very beginning of his pontificate. It introduces the critical language of *accompaniment* and *journeying* into the vocabulary of the missionary Church. To speak of the Church is no longer to speak of it as a fortress and judge, but as a pilgrim and wayfarer ready to soothe cracked feet and offer water to those who thirst along the way. Jesus appears as the Resurrected One, a stranger who is somehow familiar to the two disciples whose hopes were still dashed against the wood of the Cross back in Jerusalem. As I close with this passage from a homily by Pope Francis, I invite you to consider how your interactions with those that you greet along the journey can be moments of hope and resurrection.

Jesus' encounter with the two disciples of Emmaus is a fleeting one. But the entire destiny of the Church is contained within it. It tells us that the Christian community is not enclosed within a fortified citadel, but rather journeys along its most essential environment, which is the road. And there, it encounters people with their hopes and disappointments, burdensome at times. The Church listens to everyone's stories as they emerge from the treasure chest of personal conscience, in order to then offer the Word of Life, the witness of love, a love that is faithful until the end. And thus, the hearts of people reignite with hope.



WHERE WE ARE AS OF MARCH!

Below are the numbers for SPCNC Profit and Loss statement from the beginning of the fiscal year to the end of March with a comparison against last year. One significant factor that affected our income from 2021-2022 to 2022-2023 year was the Payroll Program Loan. We received a payment of close to \$90,000, which we were not able to benefit from this year.

Many of the increased areas in expenses were due to inflation, cost of living, and an increase in activities in our ministries. Health insurance and payroll taxes were at approximately \$33,000 higher with only \$12,000 increase in salaries and wages. World Youth Day had its first payout of funds for airfare at close to \$8,000. And although there was has been increase of \$8,000 in program and administrative expenses, there has been a healthy surge of activity throughout all of our ministries.

Therefore, in comparison our numbers may look low, but we are thriving and functioning well. Thank you for all of your support and dedication.


