Testimony of an RCIA Candidate

Greetings, my name is Mayra Suarez-Jimenez. I was baptized in the Catholic church at the age of 4. My parents were not adamant about attending church until I reached my rebellious stage at 13. The more I rebelled, the more I felt distant from my family. Soon, my brother Luis and I met the Mormon missionaries. Even though it was not where I was meant to be, I couldn't help but think it was God reaching out to me. My parents allowed my brother and I to get rebaptized in the LDS church. That is when I fell in love with the word of God. I always knew God was powerful and almighty, but it was the first time I saw God as my Father in heaven.

I enjoyed my studies of the Bible and the community of the Mormon faith. At 18, I left my parents' home to serve in the Army. I found it strange how powerful I felt at such an early stage of my life. When I moved back to California, I decided to no longer push my unanswered questions aside, so I began attending different protestant churches. They were lovely, but something was missing. Shortly after, I came across Matthew 16:18, "And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." It was clear as day; I remember thinking, the Catholic church. What?



I remember telling her on my communion day that I felt like I'd been waiting for this moment my whole life. I hope my testimony can inspire people to feel God's love and mercy.
