

WHO WAS FATHER NEGRO?

On Founders Day (Sept. 10) we celebrate the legacy of Fr. Sergio P. Negro and lay founders of our parish. Many of us weren't around before 1994 when Fr. Negro was succeeded as pastor by Fr. Perry Kavookjian and don't know about our founding pastor's legacy.

Fr. Negro was born in Italy in 1929 and at age 24 was assigned to shepherd the Fresno State Newman Club, which met at the Shrine of St. Thérèse near what is now Fresno City Col-



lege. When Fresno State relocated its campus in 1962, there was no convenient gathering place for college Catholics. He and faculty, staff and students worked with the diocese to establish this Newman Center in 1964. Fr. Negro was a model of theological scholarship, sharing his passion for the Church in meaningful homilies that resonate even today and also teaching at Fresno State. He also believed in an "All are Welcome" policy and in reaching out to the Newman and general community to meet any needs.

Although formed as a traditional Catholic priest, he initiated Vatican II changes, including greater roles for the laity – men *and* women. Fr. Negro died in 1999, but his commitment to education, hospitality and service was the inspiration for the Fr. Sergio P. Negro Scholarship Endowment, funded by today's parishioners and awarded on Founders Day to exemplary upper-division and graduate students.

ABOUT FOUNDERS DAY:

Sept. 10 is Founders Day, celebrating our founding pastor, Fr. Sergio P. Negro, and the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center's mission of service, support and spiritual sustenance to the Catholic college community and beyond. The Sergio P. Negro Scholarship Endowment was established with funds from our 50th-anniversary celebration in 2014 and augmented since by generous parishioners investing in students who will guide us tomorrow. A committee of parishioners guides the endowment and awards at least two \$2,500 scholarships each year.

Next weekend, this year's scholarship recipients will be introduced at the 9:30am and 7:00pm Masses. A special collection for the scholarship endowment will further demonstrate our commitment to our founding mission. We invite you to come and celebrate this important legacy with us.

We kicked off of student dinners with over 40 students followed by Mass. We had many new faces joining our Newman community for the first time. We continue to grow! Thank you for your support.






