THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear sisters and brothers,

Prophets speak in the name of God. That is what the word prophet means, to speak for. "I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their kindred, and will put my words into the mouth of the prophet; the prophet shall tell them all that I command" (Dt. 18:18). If the prophet doesn't speak to the wicked or evil ones, the wicked will die and the prophet will be held responsible for their deaths. The Lord states this clearly in today's first reading. This doesn't seem to touch us. We're not prophets, we're normal folks. We know tht being a prophet is something rare. Being a prophet is something from another place and age – we think!

I heard a lecture once from a theologian at a Religious Education Conference who told us that the gift of prophecy is very rare in the Church today. In fact, he doubted that they exist at all anymore. That means that nobody speaks in the name of God anymore. Wouldn't that be horrible?!!!

It would mean that Peter was mistaken in his first public speech on Pentecost Day when he announced to the people that the Prophet Joel's prophecy would be fulfilled and that all sons and daughters of God would become prophets! It would mean that when someone is anointed a prophet during baptism, in fact nothing happens! It would mean that today's gospel would be meaningless, too, because being a prophet and speaking in God's name is precisely what Jesus asks us to do today! "Speak up, don't keep your mouth shut. You will be held responsible for your silence and for the consequences of your unwillingness to speak!"

We all have ways of escaping from that duty. We say it's only meant for the church leaders – those who are especially called like Oscar Romero, or Mother Teresa, or the priests who are speaking out against injustice in Latin America.


We should take up the role of prophecy more seriously in the face of corruption, social injustice, war, and violence.

Sergio P. Negro Scholars Celebrated on Founders Day

Today is Founders Day when we remember Fr. Sergio P. Negro and the parishioners who, 59 years ago, helped create a church with a mission to serve the needs of Catholic college students, faculty and staff.

What better way to honor the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center's dedication to education and community service than to announce the three Newman Students awarded Sergio P. Negro Scholarships for study this school year?

All three have been active in Newman Center activities – especially ministry to their college-student peers; have solid academic credentials; and plan to "pay it forward" by ministering to young people after they launch post-college careers.

Eleanora (Ella) teNyenhuis, a history major at UC San Diego, is a lifelong parishioner who has served in many ministries leading the Newman Students last year. As a teacher, she plans "to provide a straightforward, nonconfusing class for students" to encourage "asking questions and seeking out help." Away from the classroom, Ella wants to minister to young people, adding, "Students and young people are an important part of the future of not only the church, but the world."





Gabriela (Gabby) Vargas, a Porterville native studying at Fresno State to become a teacher, has been active in campus ministry and the food recovery program. The Newman Center, Gabby says, "has provided me with a one-of-a-kind experience that I'll forever be grateful for." As a teacher, she plans to "create a safe space where students feel comfortable sharing their struggles, seeking advice and finding solace" so they "excel academically and also grow spiritually, emotionally and socially." **Heriberto (Beto) Vargas,** a Fresno State mechanical engineering student from Lindsay, says involvement in campus ministry programs "has allowed me to encounter Christ in a different way and see His real presence in my life and everyone around me." Beto says career success will allow him to serve "as a role model who has achieved professional success, while remaining committed to my faith." He plans to be a mentor and stay involved in Catholic youth organizations wherever his career takes him.




Each of our Negro Scholars today is being recognized for their academic and community service achievements past and ahead with a \$2,500 stipend from the Sergio P. Negro Scholarship Endowment.

It was established after the parish's 50th anniversary to provide financial assistance to Newman Center-connected students as part of our parish mission. Parishioners' generosity has helped grow the endowment, which is invested with the Diocese of Fresno to maximize the return on investment.

On this Founders Day, the Scholarship Endowment Committee chaired by Mickey Lord, encourages all parishioners to continue their support through today's second collection – extending our commitment to our founding mission.

The committee also hopes you'll take the opportunity to attend a reception between the 9:30 and 11:30 Masses to meet the scholars and their families, celebrate our parish history and learn more about the scholarship endowment.
