TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A | OCTOBER 1, 2023

In preparing for the Feast of St. Francis this upcoming Wednesday, I'd like to take a little time to spend with the Saint himself, and let his story continue its work on me. On one hand, Francis' tale follows a common script in the calendar of official saints: a rich kid does something foolish, is humbled by catastrophe, repents, and dedicates their life to a radical faith that cuts against the grain of their social location. On the other hand, Francis had a singular effect on the Church of his time, and his legacy was disputed, negotiated, and argued over almost immediately after his death. We can think of famous examples of his unique legend: preaching to animals, an audience with Egypt's sultan, or a confrontation with a notorious wolf. As I sit with his story, however, I come back to an aspect of his witness that doesn't quite inspire or amaze me, but rather *disturbs* me.

Francis of Assisi died in immense physical pain, his body worn not only by the constant burdens of active ministry but also by chronic health impairments that grew steadily worse until the end. I do not envy the life of the saint, as so many like Francis do not "end well," at least according to our current norms. His insistent and almost rapturous devotion to God's glory as expressed in physical creation is a protest against the ways that our activities do not cooperate with our Sibling the Earth. The final season of his life is also a reminder of the physical limitations of our earthly pilgrimage. Rather than eschewing the burden of his body's weakness, Francis accepted it in faith with heartfelt gratitude. For him, death is a part of the completeness of creation within which we are embedded. It should not surprise us that his famous Canticle includes the stanza: Be praised, my Lord, through our Sister Bodily Death, from whose embrace no living person can escape.

In this way, the stigmata is a sign of Christ's presence in the very cycles of life and death, and not merely a miracle instrumentalized for the sake of impressing others and reviving particular devotions. As Pope Francis writes about his namesake in *Laudato Si*, St. Francis "takes us to the heart of what it is to be human." We are reminded this week that to be human is to glorify God not as a master of creation, but as a relative of all created things and beings. As residents of California we should also mind the advice of the saint, who told his followers not to imitate him, but look to Jesus. After all, the collapse of native ecosystems and society in California began under the missionary activity of Francis' followers. May we resolve to relate in a better way to God and to each of our relations.


