DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear sisters and brothers,

In the scriptures, the banquet was a sign used by biblical writers to express God's abundant love, God's self-gift to us and a pledge of the eternal banquet with God. A meal shared with God and with one's friends in an intimate, special place: what better expression of the fullness waiting God's faithful people? This image conveys good news for all.

Meals that have a lot of love poured into them by the planners often overflow to the guests. People at the celebrations might find themselves talking to one another, perhaps breaking a chilled silence they have been keeping for some time. Sometimes the usual barriers break down: differences in skin color are put aside; people try harder to listen to each other despite language differences; personal life stories are shared and we may get to hear life from another person's perspective. Anything can happen at a meal where love has been the main ingredient. What a failure such a meal would be if the guests were frigid towards one another; if a fight were to break out; or, if people were just excessively polite and formal. How embarrassing it would be if some at the table ate more than their share while others didn't even get to taste the food.

In the first reading Isaiah sees the contrary – a well-planned meal where all are invited, get to eat the finest food and drink the choicest wine; where no "veil" covers our eyes and keeps us from seeing each other clearly, especially seeing another's needs. The prophet is describing what God has in mind for us: pain is removed, tears are addressed, all blame ended, death destroyed. The prophets and Jesus have always had this vision of how it will be and how it could be for us – beginning now. If we really believe this vision, we need to begin acting on it now by addressing the things that keep people apart, that mark distinctions between people, resulting in some being on the inside, while many are left out.

The Eucharist gives us hints of the future banquet described by Isaiah. It is "already" in our midst and we do share in the choice food and drink envisioned by the prophet. "All Peoples" are welcome and Christ is present to our hungers to-day. This meal that feeds us the fulfillment of God's vision for us. What are the hungers and thirsts we encounter? And how can we, who have been to the banquet, be of service to them, as freely as we were served on this "holy mountain, our worship space?
