THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

At the recent Synod on Synodality held in Rome, the media focused on a limited number of "hot-button" issues – women's ordination, married priests, and the blessing of gay couples. Father Tom Reese, a Jesuit priest who attended the synod, filed this report. He noted that hidden in the 40 page summary report are some surprising gems that could lead to significant reform in the church. I am highlighting some of the "gems" he uncovered.

The first is the stress on lay involvement. The synod was structured so that lay voices, including women and young people, were heard and respected. One of Pope Francis' announced goals is to involve all the baptized.

Secondly, the synod promotes "conversations in the Spirit" – enabling authentic listening in order to discern what the Sprit is saying to the Church. Combining thoughts and feelings will create a "shared vital space".

Third, the report acknowledged disagreements and uncertainties. In the past the hierarchy tended to "cover up differences". The divisions need to be acknowledged and respectful dialogue must take place to reconcile them.

Fourth, the concerns of women are addressed. The need for inclusive dialogue and participation in decision-making processes must be promoted, so that women may assume more roles of responsibility in pastoral care and ministry.

Fifth, the poor and the marginalized were not forgotten. "... Putting those who experience poverty . . . and learning from them is something the Church must do more and more"

Sixth, it challenges the Church with combating racism and xenophobia, saying it needs to take action. "Systems within the Church that create or maintain racial injustices need to be identified and addressed."

Seventh, abuse in the Church must be dealt with. A suggestion – "setting up a legal body separate from the bishop to handle cases involving clerical abuse."

I will continue this report next week.
