Dear Friends.

My name is Robert Pyrka, I am a Claretian missionary from Poland. I am 40 years old and have lived exactly half of my life in our Congregation. When I was searching for my place in the Church and the desire for missions matured in me more and more. I did not think for a moment that the place would be where I am today. The word mission caused me to think more about South America or other parts of the world in my mind, because I speak Spanish. But our Superior General had other plans for my mission. I



am very grateful today to be part of the US - Canada Province.

It is amazing how all the time the Lord God surprises us and shows us that His plans are really different and much more beautiful than we think. I've only been in the U.S. for five weeks, but I've already managed to notice how much good has happened in my life during this time, from my community that welcomed me to the parishes I've had the opportunity to visit. Ever since I can remember I have always been attracted to missionary work in the church, I have been fascinated by Father Claret, who was all his life on the road, on the move, constantly seeking what was good and necessary in the work of saving people. When I think of our Founder, I like to have close to me my favorite image of him--the image where he is depicted as a pilgrim, from whose heart comes fire. I imagine that often the Lord God invites me to go out on such a journey and when I respond to His invitation positively He ignites me with beautiful things.

When I was discerning my vocation and looking for a congregation to join, a friend of mine invited me to a Claretian house. Interestingly, at that time I didn't experience anything spectacular, I didn't hear any voice that could tell me that this was the right address, but seeing the relationships between the brothers I met then, I thought this was it. Since then I have seen this very strongly, that God invites us precisely to relationships, first precisely with Him and then between us. And I think it is relationships that are the driving force in our life and vocation.


I remember how happy I was when I saw the message from Father Paul, my new Provincial and the information that my first place of service in the US would be Fresno. Admittedly, I don't know much about the city itself, nor of the state of California, (I only associate it with sunshine and good wine) but I believe that there will be a beautiful chapter in my life and service to wonderful people. Although writing these words I am still in Chicago, I remember those I will soon reach in prayer and ask you very much for it. I send my warmest greetings to you and see you in Fresno.
