### A PLAYLIST FOR ADVENT

Some people have expressed surprise that I don't really listen to "Christian music." Yet the season of Advent is one of the few times each year that I consistently open myself to sacred music and listen to it for its own sake. It's not that I don't find the Jesus-songs meaningful at other times of the year, but I do feel a bit disconnected when it's not tied to worship with other people.

Although I am wearied by the consumerism that has only gotten more intense as we move closer to Christmas, Advent feels different. For me, it is an antidote to all this season's noise. Advent invites me to sink into the quiet, tender moments of waiting that arise in the darkest time of the year, announcing the hope of salvation before the light comes back on the other side of the Solstice. Thus I'd like to share a few of the records, songs, and compositions that get me through the darkness. If you listen and like any of these, please let me know so we can talk about it!

#### The Porter's Gate: Advent Songs (Integrity, 2021)

Probably the closest thing you'll find to "Contemporary Christian Music" on this list, the Porter's Gate release thoughtful, gentle, and meditative original compositions that cut across the evangelical, mainline, and high church traditions. This record is no exception, with its track list amounting to the opposite of ostentatious holiday songs. Key track: "He Comes."

#### Sufjan Stevens: Songs for Christmas (Asthmatic Kitty, 2006)

My favorite songwriter of all time also sits atop a massive pile of hymns, carols, and original compositions that celebrate the mirth, joy, and gentle tragedies of Christmastime. Banjos, acoustic guitars, and the feeling of intimacy is trademark Sufjan, but this is also one of the best examples of his Christian faith shining through with unpretentious clarity. Key track: "That Was the Worst Christmas Ever!"

#### Bebe and Cece Winans: First Christmas (Capitol, 1993)

This record originally found its way into my listening habits for purely nostalgic reasons, as my parents would frequently play this for me when I was a child in Richmond, Virginia. But the staying power of its gospel tunes, especially the heart-expanding version of "Ooh Child" and "Give Me A Star" keep me coming back.

#### Chanticleer: A Chanticleer Christmas (San Francisco Chanticleer, 2010)

I saw this group perform at the Oakland Cathedral some years ago, and their beautiful rendition of the aching "Ave Maria" by Franz Biebl merits its inclusion on this list.


#### Javier Busto: Hondarraibia ametsetan (self-released, 2005)

A powerful and sometimes eerie collection of Basque hymns, Latin pieces, and original choral works from one of the best contemporary composers I've heard. Key Track: "O magnum mysterium."

### Faith, Family & Friends wishes all of our

parishioners a wonderful Christmas and New Year! We will be taking a 3 week break over the holidays but will return on Tuesday, Jan. 9th. We will begin the New Year with a slightly **new schedule:** we will all gather - parents, youth and children - at 6:00pm in Cardinal Newman Hall. Individual class sessions will begin at 6:15pm and end at 7:15pm. This will allow families additional time after work and school activities to arrive with less stress.

Adult Topics: In January, the adults will again have 3 class options: a Family Life topic - Parenting Strategies; a Catholic Faith topic - Caring for the Whole Person & Catholic Apologetics; and a Prayer option - SoulCore.
