Besides Christmas, there is so much happening in the next couple of months to inspire us to respond to our parish vision which is "Bringing the transformative power of Christ to all by becoming the intellectual center for innovations and best practices in all aspects of worship and ministry".

Hopefully the programs that we offer will sharpen our vision and inspire our mission here at the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center. Please contact me for more information about anything mentioned and look for more detail on our website and Sunday Bulletin!

The Food Recovery Program serves a nutritious meal each Friday evening from 5:30pm to 6:30pm in the Cafeteria. We have four teams of committed volunteers but please come on a Friday for a meal and spend time in community with those we are serving. It will give you an opportunity to see how you could become involved in some way during 2023. Hope to see you on January 3, 10, 17, 24 or 31!

Beginning on January 10, and concluding on April 25, Deacon John Supino and Jim Grant will co-facilitate 12 sessions on "Vatican II in Plain English" and will meet on Tuesdays as part of Faith Family and Friends from 6:00pm to 7:00pm. The Series will begin with an Introduction to the Council, then focus on the four main documents: Revelation, Church, Liturgy, and the Church in the Modern World. This course will be unabashedly positive and interactive. Everyone is welcome to attend who wants to examine the new direction proposed by Vatican Council II, a "Second Pentecost" for the People of God. The final sessions will connect the Council to the Synodal Process which we are currently engaged in and offer us ways to see the "Signs of the Times" and what needs to be addressed by the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center. Besides presentations and discussions, resources will be shared with all participants. At 61 years of age, the Second Vatican Council is as enlightening and vibrant as ever, and we hope you'll see why, beginning January 10!

In February, the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center will be hosting "Recognizing the Stranger", a Diocesan-wide community organizational training. This Leadership Training is scheduled for February 3 and 4 from 9:00am to 5:00pm. The training is facilitated by IAF (Industrial Areas Foundation) and will focus on how our parish can respond to the same challenges St. Paul addressed to the Church in Corinth (1 Cor. 11:-17-34) and truly act into what being "the Body of Christ" really means. IAF leaders recently returned from a group visit with Pope Francis regarding their work. This training will help attendees follow the Holy Father's call to become the Synodal Church of Encounter and Accompaniment that is rooted in our baptism. It will also offer a renewed understanding of Christ's presence among us in everyone, especially those who are marginalized.

Interfaith Scholar Weekend, March 10-12, 2023. The theme is "Faith in a Multicultural Nation" with scholar, Reverend Paul Rauschenbush, President of the Interfaith Alliance. For more information please go to the website: interfaithscholar.org.

Enough for now! Beginning with a deeper meaning of Jesus' Incarnation this Christmas, may we all learn to see Him, love Him, and follow Him in the "distressing disguise" which He assumes in our daily lives, as St. Teresa of Calcutta challenged us.

Sinban Gabi Mass Thursday, December 22 from 6:00pm to 8:00pm

SIMBANG Gabi, which literally means "evening or night Mass," is a Filipino Christmas tradition. As a devotional practice in the tradition of the novena, it is a series of nine evening Masses usually celebrated during Advent from December 16-24, in preparation for Christmas Day.

Simbang Gabi originated from the Missa Aurea (golden Mass or Angel's Mass) practiced by the Roman Catholic Church. The tradition was introduced by the Spanish friars at the start of the Catholic evangelization of the Philippines, specifically to allow farmers to hear mass before going to the fields in the morning.

Simbang Gabi is not just a tradition that is celebrated because we need to do so. It is a way for us to worship and praise God. It is the spiritual preparation for Christmas, in commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ....

Furthermore, this religious tradition encourages community development and camaraderie among parishioners through a common effort of prayer, celebration, fellowship and charity. Finally, for Filipinos living overseas — especially in the United States — observing *Simbang Gabi* helps maintain a connection with their roots in the Philippines.

But no matter the language, the place or the time this revered Filipino tradition is observed and celebrated, when you pray and attend the *Simbang Gabi*, you realize how truly universal, significant and important the Christmas spirit is for every Christian. *Simbang Gabi* in its very essence provides a very strong indication of the depth of faith among the Filipino people.
