The Epiphany of the Lord, Year B

January 3, 2021

Readings: IS 60: 1-6; EPH 3:2-3A, 5-6; MT 2: 1-12

THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Matthew's story of the adoration of the magi has often been better understood by poets and artists than by scripture scholars. The poet and artist view scripture with awe and love — with the heart. The scholar approaches scripture systematically and analytically — with the head. Both have their place, but the story shows how Jesus enriches those who come to Him with their hearts. The magi came with joy and excitement in their hearts to see the Christ Child and God allowed them to see amazing things.

Although, at our Christmas pageants, we group shepherds and wise men together around the manger, the shepherds came from nearby and the wise men from far away. The wise men's visit probably took place long after the shepherds had left. Mary and Joseph remained near Bethlehem and Jerusalem until Jesus had been circumcised and presented in the Temple. Mary also needed time to recover from the delivery before traveling back to Nazareth.

Mathew includes some "dark" elements in his story:

- Joseph decides to divorce Mary (Mt 1:19)
- Herod kills babies in an attempt to do away with the newborn king (Mt 2:16-18)
- Joseph and his family flee to Egypt to escape Herod's murder attempt (Mt 2:19-23)

There are a number of important and interesting parallels between the stories of Moses and Jesus:

- Pharaoh ordered that all Hebrew baby boys should be killed (Ex 1:16-22) just as Herod does (Mt 2:16-18).
- Moses was saved through the intervention of Pharaoh's daughter (Ex 2:1-10) just as Jesus is saved by a dream warning Joseph and Mary to flee (Mt 2:13)
- As a young man, Moses fearing for his life, fled from Pharaoh (Ex 2:15)
- The Lord told Moses, "Return to Egypt, for all those who sought your life are dead" (Ex 4:19), just as an angel will say to Joseph, "Rise, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel for those who sought the child's life are dead" (Mt 2:19-20)

Matthew clearly intends for us to notice these parallels and to see Jesus as a Moses-like figure. However, we need to remember this significant difference: while Moses (at God's direction) saved Israel from slavery, Jesus will save the world from its sins.

Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: In Sunday's Gospel we hear the story of the "astrologers from the east" who came to pay homage to the infant Jesus. They remind us that Jesus was a universal Savior. He came to redeem all of us, including the lepers, tax collectors, and prostitutes. He even reached out to the hated Samaritans, although it was forbidden by law to have any type of contact with them. Your challenge this week is to explore how open you are to the "Samaritans" in your life—those people who are different from you in their faith, their ethnicity, their politics, or their lifestyles. Then do two things. First, find something you share in common with this group. Recognize your common humanity. Second, learn one new thing about this group that you didn't know before which is worth celebrating. It might be a prayer practice you could embrace, or a recipe for their food which you could try. It could even be a new way of caring for God's creation. Open your heart to be stretched, get out of your comfort zone, and discover the face of God in the Samaritans around you!


This Week's Readings at Mass

- ▶ Isaiah 60:1-6 Glory of the new Zion
- ► Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 Commission to preach God's plan
- ► Matthew 2:1-12 The visit of the Magi

The Feast of the Epiphany brings the Christmas season to a close as the Magi visit the infant Jesus. "Epiphany" is a Greek word meaning a "showing" or "manifestation." In this context it refers to the public recognition of Jesus as the newborn king of the Jews.

Not much is known about the Magi: their names, their country of origin, or even how many there were is never mentioned in the Bible. So who were they? In Jesus' time, the term Magi referred to a caste of Persian priests. They were astrologers who looked to the stars as guides. We don't know their place of origin, except that it was from somewhere east of the Holy Land, perhaps Arabia or the Syrian desert because of the gifts they brought.

Whoever they were, the mysterious people who came to worship Jesus were pagan foreigners. They would have been well-educated and wealthy. They were also seekers, willing to give up the comforts of their daily lives for a long journey to an unknown destination. They were courageous enough to seek an audience with the feared tyrant, King Herod. Clearly, something very powerful was drawing them, and they trusted that they were being led. Later, they trusted their dreams that they should



were changed by the baby and the Holy Family they met.


