

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, Year C

June 19, 2022

Readings: Gn 14:18-20; 1 Cor 11:23-26; Lk 9:11b-17

DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week begins the National Eucharistic Revival, a grassroots effort launched by the U.S. bishops to reignite "devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist". What better day to begin than on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, when we as Catholics reflect on the source and summit of our faith. "For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself ..." (Catechism 1324). Our readings today remind us that the Eucharist is more than a powerful symbol; as Catholics, we believe we receive Christ himself — body, blood, soul, and divinity — in the form of the consecrated bread and wine. As Pope Francis said in a homily on this solemnity in 2019: "If we receive it into our hearts, this bread will release in us the power of love. We will feel blessed and loved, and we will want to bless and love in turn." That is what the early disciples did, whether feeding the 5,000 or nurturing the early Church. The Eucharistic Revival gives each of us an opportunity to give thanks for the gift of the Eucharist and share it with others. Grow as a disciple-pray-study-engage-serve!

On today's solemnity, also known as the feast of Corpus Christi, we will have eucharistic processions prior to the 9:30am Mass and the 7:00pm Mass. A consecrated host – that is, the real and substantial presence of Jesus Christ, body, blood, soul and divinity – will be placed within a monstrance, which is then lifted and carried by a priest who leads the faithful in procession beginning at one holy place and ending at another. You also may have an opportunity for eucharistic adoration. Both of these are excellent opportunities to spend time with Jesus and reflect on Christ's gift of himself in the Eucharist. What should be our response to this gift? As Pope Francis has said, it is a call "to go out and bring Jesus to others". Just as Jesus challenged the disciples when they didn't think they had enough bread and fish to serve the 5,000, we may feel we "don't have enough" to give. Nourished by the Eucharist, however, and by our devotion to the real presence of God in that Eucharist, we have all we need to go out and witness to the love of Jesus. Go forth and announce the Gospel of the Lord by your life!

Flu Guidelines

- Get your flu shot, get plenty of rest, eat a balanced diet, drink water and exercise.

Since Christ is at the very center of creation, let us choose an organic bread to honor the Body of Christ. Often times farmer's markets and small bakeries carry bread that is more responsibly produced. Consider switching your bread buying power to such vendors.

Parish Registration

There are instances when, as a member of the parish, you must provide verification of membership at the Newman Center. This is necessary as it applies to the administration of Sacraments and the required record- keeping. For this reason, we ask you to please register as a member of the parish.

Verification (written) of membership in this non-territorial parish of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Fresno may be provided for any baptized Catholic who fulfills any of the following:

- registered in our parish database for a period of six months or more
- reference of regular parish involvement by a member of the parish pastoral staff
- identification as a regular member of our worshiping community (attendance at Mass on the Lord's Day) by a member of our pastoral staff

Since we, unlike other Catholic parishes, do not have a specific territorial area, designated by parish boundaries, living in the vicinity of the St. Paul Catholic Newman Center does not automatically mean membership in this parish. (The territorial parish area in which SPCNC is located covers portions of Saint Anthony of Padua parish and Sacred Heart parish.) Hence, personal registration, active involvement and participation in worship and other activities on a regular basis are required to receive any documenting letter (e.g. for purposes of being a Catholic sponsor/godparent) of membership in SPCNC.

For What Are You Hungry?

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Genesis 14:18-20 The priest Melchizedek
- ▶ 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 The Eucharist
- ► Luke 9:11b-17 Feeding the 5,000

The story of the feeding of the 5,000 is extraordinary in several ways. The fantastic miracle of the multiplication of the loaves is the most obvious. That was the flashy part. The substance behind the miracle, though, was Jesus' compassion for the crowd which had followed him, or sought him, far out in the wilderness.

The people in the crowd didn't go out into the wilderness to get food from Jesus because they were hungry. Who, in their right mind, would leave their home or village to go seeking food out in the desert? No, when the scene begins, the people are out in the wilderness because they are hungry for something else. (It sounds similar to the story of the crowds of people who went out to see and hear John the Baptist in the wilderness.) What are people hungry for besides food? Hope. Peace. Security. Justice. Health and wholeness. Reassurance that they are known and loved and that God will care for them.

Throughout the Gospels, Jesus was incredible in his ability to see through people to the heart of what they most needed. For some, it was physical healing. For some, words of forgiveness and mercy. For some, words of truth and justice addressed to the powerful. So

when a

crowd of people seeks out Jesus in the wilderness, he offers them what they are most hungry for, healing for their illnesses and teachings about the Kingdom of God. After they spend the entire day with Jesus, then their physical hunger comes to the forefront, and Jesus provides for them in this way too.
