#### THE DEACON'S SPEAKIN'

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"You are pruned because of the word that I spoke to you."

The Bible is a book used by so many in different ways. For some it's a sacred object, to be placed on a table and reverenced, but not read. For others it's a weapon, its phrases to be thrown at enemies in judgment and condemnation. The Bible may be a shield to be worn in battle. It may be used for study in groups, a collection of ancient myths, or meaningful words to live by. But when it's proclaimed at Mass, the Bible serves as a primary tool for believers. It cuts through our excuses, tears down our defenses, brings an end to meaningless ambitions, and challenges us to bear fruit for the reign of God. As much as we'd like to use its fiery words against others, it's intended to be a tool to feed our spirits and fire our hearts to follow Christ.

This is why the Liturgy of the Word holds such an important and prominent place at Mass. It is as essential as the sacrament we consume at the Eucharistic table. The Word is broken open as a parallel to the breaking of the bread. It reminds us that Christ is present in the Scripture we hear and share. Both God's word and flesh are our food. No meal for Catholics is complete without the two.

The metaphor of the pruning tool helps us to understand more deeply the role of the Word in our Eucharist. It's not simply a recounting of our history, or operating instructions for our journey of discipleship, but a vital and dedicated intervention of God's will in our lives.

God acts in the Word, bringing life to those who listen!

# Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: On May 1st we honor St. Joseph as the patron saint of workers. Did you know that May 1 is also Holocaust Remembrance Day? That might sound grim; after all, who wants to remember something so unspeakably evil? But the maxim that those who don't learn from history are doomed to repeat it has been proven true time and time again in human history. Remembering the holocaust is one way to ensure that we never again experience a similar event. Your challenge this week is to reflect on the holocaust which took place in Hitler's Germany. Discuss as a household what you know about it. Research why it happened, and how Hitler got so many people caught up in trying to exterminate an entire race of people. Then ask yourself what little steps of prejudice and hatred led up to the big "Final Solution" of seeking extinction for the entire Jewish people. Commit yourself and your family to confronting one of the little steps towards racism or prejudice wherever you see it. This might be as simple as standing up to people who make jokes at the expense of a particular group of people; it could mean advocating to oppose regimes across the world which engage in genocide. Whatever you decide to do, hold all of the victims of the holocaust in your heart as you work to make sure that history does not repeat itself. Help insure that the victims did not die in vain.

# **Human Beings**, **Not Human Doings**

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Acts 9:26-31 Saul visits Jerusalem
- ▶ 1 John 3:18-24 The actions of believers
- ▶ John 15:1-8 The vine and the branches

We hear often from John's Gospel during the Easter season, and Jesus' message to us includes many invitations to abide, rest, and remain in him. The other Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke have Jesus giving us many directions for the actions we should be taking as his followers: feed the hungry, clothe the naked, love your enemies, forgive others repeatedly, turn the other cheek, etc. They are Gospels for "human doings." John's Gospel, on the other hand, is a Gospel for "human beings."

In John, Jesus repeatedly invites his followers to express their discipleship by how they carry

themselves—how they are in the world, not what they do in the world. How are we to be in the world? Like a branch on a grape vine, Jesus says. The branch doesn't do anything to make the grapes; it simply remains connected to the vine and allows itself to be pruned. If the branch stays connected,

all it has to do in order to bear fruit is to be open while God works the miracle of creating the grapes.

Jesus is calling us to trust that if we do our primary "work" of remaining in him and allowing him to remain in us, then God's works will automatically

flow through us. If we can be human beings first, then our "doings" will be natural outcomes of that. The invitation for us is to relax into that sense of being and abiding with Iesus.



"By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


