Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Thank you for accepting Pope Francis' invitation to implement his 2015 Encyclical On Care For Our Common Home, and for all our brothers and sisters, especially those most vulnerable and marginalized.

On May 25, 2021, the Holy Father gave us the Laudato Si Action Platform (LSAP), a seven-year journey of ecological conversion in action (https://laudatosiactionplatform.org/).

We are invited to embark on this journey together with the seven sectors:

- 1. Families 2. Parishes and dioceses 3. Educational institutions
- 4. Hospitals and health care centers 5.the economy
- 6. organizations and groups 7. Religious orders.

Our journey will be inspired by Encyclical and guided by the 7 Laudato Si Goals:

- 1. Cry of the Earth 2. Cry of the Poor 3. Ecological Economics
- 4. Simple Lifestyles 5. Ecological Education 6. Ecological Spirituality and
- 7. Community Engagement with Participatory Action.

The LSAP envisages a shared journey leading to a peoples' movement from below contributing to the critical mass needed for radical societal transformation. As Pope Francis reminds us, "All of us can contribute as instruments of God for the c are of creation, each according to his or her culture, experience, involvements and talents" (Laudato Si, #14)

The Laudato Si Action Platform will create a space for the universal Church- and "every person living on this planet" (L.S. # 3) to respond to the global emergency we are facing, which the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) addressed in its "Code Red" warning in its Report this past August.

On October 4, Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, we began a 40-days LSAP prayer and promotion campaign, and the enrollment of participants in the platform will begin on November 14- the Global Day of Prayer for the Poor.

I warmly invite all of you to join the LSAP and actively support it. The Laudato Si Action Platform offers an opportunity to develop existing efforts while also inspiring and supporting communities only beginning the journey towards integral ecology.(L.S. #137-162).

May God bless all our humble efforts for the care of our common home and the most vulnerable members of our common household, and we take the opportunity to confirm our closeness and availability.

To Serve of Be Served?

This Week's Readings at Mass

- ► Isaiah 53:10-11 The suffering servant
- ► Hebrews 4:14-16 Jesus, compassionate high priest
- ► Mark 10:35-45 Ambition of James and John

Mark's Gospel, more than any of the other three Gospels, paints a picture of the twelve apostles as a bumbling, immature group that keeps getting things wrong, misunderstanding their teacher, and arguing amongst themselves.

The passage today follows immediately after Jesus' third prediction of his upcoming death. How do the disciples respond? James and John change the subject and ask for a special favor—they each want a position of honor when Jesus comes into his glory.

As usual, Jesus turns their thinking upside down. Now is not the time to talk about glory. Now is the time to be realistic about how the world treats people who speak up for justice and work for peace. The Old Testament was clear that prophets who spoke truth to power were often killed. Jesus realizes his apostles will face similar opposition, and he asks them if they are willing to risk such suffering. As readers, we get the feeling James and John don't know what they are committing themselves to when they say they can

Sheepish Question:

With all God's given me, what's stopping me from reflecting his image for others to see?

drink the same cup as Jesus. They just want to get to the glory.

It is not surprising that the other disciples get upset with James' and John's power-grab, and their anger leads to yet another lesson by Jesus about the alternative nature of God's kingdom. Jesus raises up the position of lowly servants and demotes the rulers. He puts the slave first and the first last. He is clear that rather than racing to the top, the apostles should be humbling themselves to serve.
